Report of World AIDs Day

Date: 08.12.2022

The Institution had organised a programme in collaboration with Karnataka State AIDs Control Board, Bengaluru, District Administration, Zilla Panchayath, District Health and Family Welfare Department, District AIDs Control and Prevention Unit, NSS Unit, Youth Redcross Unit, Chitradurga. The programme based on the World AIDs Day and National Voluntary Blood Donation Day arranged a special lecture to share the need and importance of the blood and the life of a human being.

The programme was compared by Santosh. K, 2nd Year-3 Years LL.B student. It was began with the beautiful invocation sung by Shamanth, 1st Year-3 Years LL.B student which was followed by the welcome speech delivered by Keerthana Reddy, 2nd Year-3 Years LL.B student.

The introductory speech about the programme was delivered by Ashok, District Supervisor, District AIDs Control and Prevention Unit, Chitradurga. He gave the statistics of the AIDs patients all over the world. Where India stands in 3rd place and Karnataka stands in 16th position. In Chitradurga District 8175 AIDs patients have been detected so far. He also narrated the precautions to be taken to prevent the AIDs, which do not have any treatment.

The inauguration of the programme was laid by Dr. R. Ranganath, District Health Officer, Chitradurga and other dignitaries of the stage by watering the plant. In his inaugural speech, he narrated the abbreviated forms of AIDs and HIV and the difference between that is HIV is a virus and AIDs is an effect of such virus. One should always fight against HIV AIDs but not against the AIDs patients. He also stressed upon the theme of the AIDs Day 2022 equalise, which emphasis eliminating the inequalities that have slowed the fight against the disease.

The programme was further followed by honouring the people who donated their blood, highest number of times in the year 2022.

For the awareness about the AIDs, HIV and Blood Donation the essay competition was been conducted in the college campus for the students on the topic 'Role of Youth in Prevention of HIV AIDs' dated 06.12.2022. Around 17 students were participated in the essay competition. In this occasion the prize distribution for the essay competition was made and the list is as under.

A special lecture by Dr. Roopashri, District Surgeon, ART Centre, District Hospital, Chitradurga was delivered where she concentrated on 'Youth and HIV- an overview of HIV scenario'. She said prevention is better than cure, where the Government choose the youth to create awareness regarding HIV and AIDs. Getting HIV tests is a must and for this there is a separate HIV Act which was enforced in the year 2017 to give surety of confidentiality. She also narrated the basic facts on HIV, roots of spread of HIV, signs and symptoms of AIDs. ART stands for Anti Retro Viral therapy and the aims and objectives of this unit. She concluded by saying that the youth should be more aware regarding this disease because there is no treatment for this disease.


On this occasion the dedication and hard work of Non-Teaching Faculties are also been recognised appreciated and a honour was made to them.



On this occasion the Institution had organized this awareness program to educate the children and equip them with knowledge and life skills required to protect themselves from undesirable situation.

Thus, under the POCSO the spouse of a person below the age of 18 can be penalized. In India child marriages still take place in various regions usual in rural and semi urban areas. Due to improper vigilance and manifestation of the social norms it is still persisting. It is also the sexual abuse of a married women who is under the age of 18, in few Child Marriages the minor girls are not yet attained the age of maturity.

Murali. H. Kannada Teacher, Chinmaladri National High School, Chitradurga Children are supremely important national assets, require special attention and protection against all sorts of ill-treatment and exploitation, among these the prominent is child marriage which is found the most in India. Despite having law against child marriage for the last more than 90 years, child marriage is an acrid reality in our country

and political crisis. She gave motivating and extremely informative information regarding gender justice.










