Sri. H. Hanumanthappa Former Member of Rajya Sabha President, Saraswathi Education Society (R), Chitradurga, in his presidential speech said Lal Bahadur Shastri was the Second Prime Minister of India, after Jawaharlal Nehru. He was in office from June 9, 1964, till his death on January 11, 1966. Born on October 2, 1904, he shares his birthday with Mahatma Gandhi, of whom Shastri was an ardent follower. He was also the Minister of External Affairs from April 1961 to August 1963, and then the Minister of External Affairs from June 1964 to July 1964. He urged the students to learn the values and principles, which Gandhiji and Shastriji held dear in their life, like truth, non-violence, respect for all beings, self-discipline, unity, harmony, sharing and caring. The students got motivated to follow the footsteps of these great personalities in every walk of life. Going a step forward in helping the students understand all about the freedom struggle and the role of Mahatma Gandhi in helping us win our independence non-violently, the students were given a deep insight into the life and times of Mahatma Gandhi and encouraged to think about the sacrifice of our freedom fighters, analyze the importance and understand the value of freedom, through the day’s activities.

Report on Legal Awareness Programme Under “Vidhan Se Samadhan”

Date: 09.10.2024

Under the joint aegis of National Commission for Women, National Legal Services Authority, New Delhi, Karnataka State Legal Services Authority, Bengaluru and District Legal Services Authority, Chitradudrga, a legal awareness program was organized in the Zilla Panchayath Auditorium, Chitradurga, on Wednesday at 10.00am.

The awareness program organized on the topic "Vidhan se Samadhan" was inaugurated through watering to the plant by Sri Ron Vasudev, Hon'ble Principal District and Sessions Judge, Chitradurga and President District Legal Services Authority, Chitradurga and other dignitaries on the dais.

The Chief Guests on the occasion were Sri. M. Vijay, Senior Civil Judge and Member Secretary, District Legal Services Authority, Chitradurga, Smt. Prof. Dr. Sudha Devi M. S. Principal, Saraswathi Law College, Chitradurga, Sri. Y. Thippeswamy, President, Advocates Association, Chitradurga, Smt. Bharathi R. Banakar, Deputy Director, Women and Child Development Department, Chitradurga.

On this occasion, Sri. Somashekar S. J. I.A.S, Chief Executive Officer, Chitradurga explained in detail about the crimes related to women. Especially the provisions related to human trafficking, dowry act, witch-hunting etc. were given and case studies related to women harassment by the National Commission for Women were also discussed.

The I Session was opened by Dr. N. D. Gowda, Assistant Professor, Saraswathi Law College, Chitradurga who narrated the Domestic Violence Act and Dowry Harassment Under BNS. He said though Domestic Violence may happen with wife, husband, son, daughter, mother, father, grandparent or any other family member, violence against women assumes alarming proportions in all societies. The factors contributing to this could be the desire to gain control over another family member, the desire to exploit someone for personal benefits, psychological problems and social influence also add to the vehemence. Gender equality and empowerment are on the top of the development agenda across the globe, yet the cases of violence against women in family and society are still on the increase.

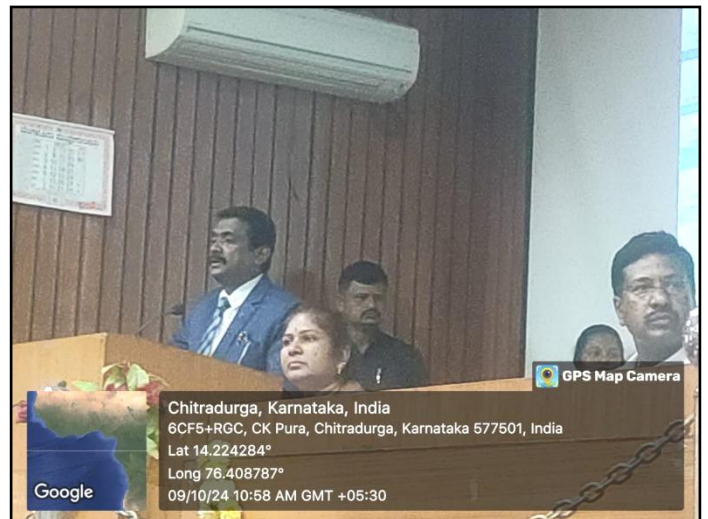

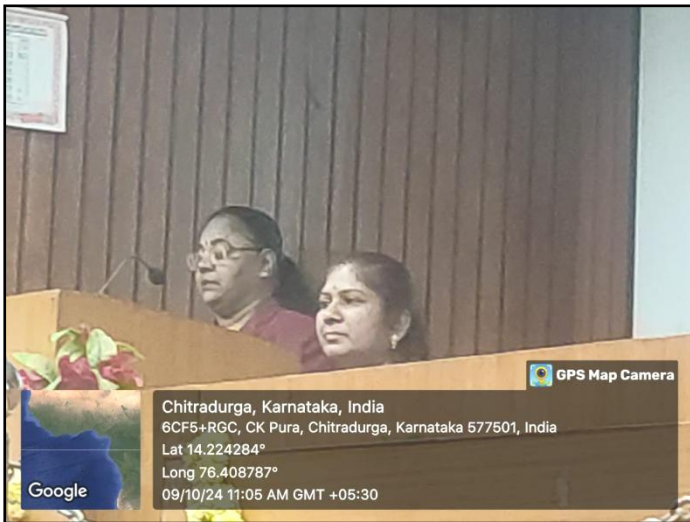

Report on Educational Prison Visit to District Prison Chitradurga Date: 17.10.2024

The Institution, organized Educational Prison Visit to the District Prison Chitradurga for the final year LL.B and B.A.LL.B, students on 17th, October 2024. Mr. Marakatti, Assistant Superintendent of Prison, facilitated this educational 'Jail Visit Programme', which was coordinated by Sri Srishyla. L, Assistant Professor, Saraswathi Law College, Chitradurga. A total 90 students participated on this occasion. The Faculty member accompanied the students. Dr. D. B. Ravikumar, Assistant Professor, gave certain general guidelines for the students about the disciplines to be followed by the students and the prisoners in the jail. The students gained valuable experience and an understanding of how the prison operates. By guiding the students, the Prison Authorities assisted them in appreciating how everything works in a Prison. During the visit, the students were taken to the Jail Dispensary where they got to understand the procedure followed by authorities when it comes to the medical treatment given to Prisoners. The students were also escorted to the Jail Auditorium where the under trial prisoners will be given chance to explore their talents during the recreation time. There was also a separate Women Prison where only girl students were allowed to visit it. Around 22 women prisoners were there and our students interacted with them. The question-hour session between the law students and the prison authorities organized was at last hour of the visit. This visit was totally insightful as it made students aware about the jail administration and the conditions prevailing there. It also broke students' stereotypes that students had formed of the prison on the basis of movies. It also exposed students to the humane side of the prisoners as opposed to their pre conceived notions of them.

The Institution, had celebrated National Legal Services Day on 9th November 2024. This is to commemorate the enactment of the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987 that came into effect on 9 November 1995. This National Legal Services Day plays an important role in the implementation of objectives through the process of organizing legal awareness programme, and other outreach programs. With this concept Saraswathi Law College, Chitradurga in collaboration with Girls Junior High School and College, Chitradurga had organized the Legal Awareness programme on this occasion for 9th Std., students.

The Programme was compared by Sri P. C. Murugesappa, Physical Education Director, Saraswathi Law College, Chitradurga. Sri Sandesh J.R, Assistant Professor, Saraswathi Law College was the coordinator of the programme who, delivered the Welcome speech.

The Programme was inaugurated by watering to the plant by Sri Kariyanna, Head Master, Government Girls High School, Chitradurga, and other dignitaries on the dais.

Sri Kariyanna delivered the inaugural address and said the most important objective of National Legal Services Day is to empower people to be more aware of legal rights and mechanisms for resolving disputes. It emphasizes that an economically disabled person should not be deprived of representation in court. On this very day, various arrangements have been made so that awareness is generated about free legal services and equal access to justice.

Smt. Harsha. S.M, Assistant Professor, Saraswathi Law College, Chitradurga said that the main purpose of this Awareness Programme was to sensitize the general masses, especially Children about the importance of Prevention of Child Marriages in India. She threw light on few provisions of Prohibition of Child Marriage Act 2005, by narrating a short story impressing upon the gathering especially Children and Women victims to come forward and approach various Legal Services Institutions for redressal of their grievances. She also apprised the beneficiaries about the free legal aid services by District Legal Services Authority and informing about the free helpline number 1098 and 112.

Prof. Dr. M.S. Sudhadevi, Principal, Saraswathi Law College, Chitradurga had presided the programme. She explained that The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, enacted in 2012 in India, is a comprehensive law aimed at protecting children from sexual abuse and exploitation. It defines various forms of sexual offenses against children and prescribes stringent punishments for offenders. The act also mandates special procedures for the reporting, recording and trial of offenses to ensure the safety and well-being of child victims throughout the legal process. She further discussed about good touch and bad touch explaining in detail both and why is it important for every child to know the difference between both.

Then the Students of Saraswathi Law College performed the wonderful skit, which exhibited the Sexual harassment, Child Marriage and its effects, Dowry harassment, in a short span of time, which was marvelously presented and created Awareness for the audience. The skit was appreciated with a big applause by the gathering. The programme was concluded by vote of thanks. Around 50 students took benefit of the programme.



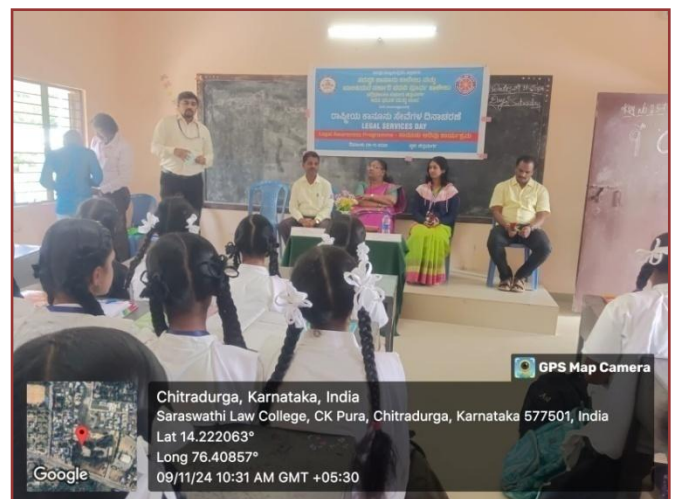

Murugesappa said, this year, the nation observes the day with reverence and reflection, recalling her enduring legacy as leader who shaped the country's political, social, and economic trajectory. As India continues to evolve into a global power, National Integration Day serves as a reminder of Gandhi's role in strengthening the fabric of national unity and integration.

The chief guests, faculty members and the students paid tribute to Former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi on her 107th birth anniversary by showering the flowers on her portrait.

Prof. Dr. M. S. Sudhadevi, Principal, addressed the gathering and said, National Integration Day was officially introduced by the Indian National Congress in 1985 to commemorate Indira Gandhi's contribution to India's unity. The holds particular significance as it is a time to celebrate the country's diversity while recognizing the importance of working together for the greater good of the nation. She also said that India, a country of rich cultural , linguistic, and religious diversity, has often faced challenges that test the limits of its unity. During Indira Gandhi's tenure as the PM, from 1966 to 1977 and again from 1980 until her tragic assassination in 1984, she worked tirelessly to foster national integration and She holds the distinction of being India's first and only female prime minister so far, leaving an enduring legacy in Indian governance and the congress party. She concluded her speech by saying that, through Indira Gandhi's policies and leadership, she sought to unite the country, bringing together people from different regions, cultures, and backgrounds under the banner of a single nation.

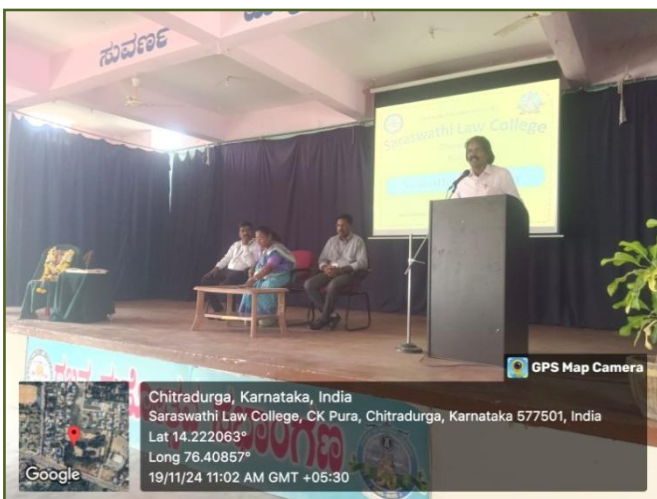

Report on Awareness programme on “Demonstration for First Aid to Victims of Heart Attack”

Date: 23.12.2024

The Saraswathi Law College, Chitradurga, under the Red Cross Unit, NSS and IQAC in collaboration with Sahyadri Narayana Multi Specialty Hospital, Shivamogga initiative, addressed the rising cases of heart attacks nationwide. With a 12.5% increase in deaths due to cardiac arrests, the CPR training sought to create a more informed and prepared society capable of responding to medical emergencies effectively.

Sri P. C. Murugeshappa, Physical Director, hosted the programme. Dr. D. B. Ravikumar was the coordinator of the programme. The programme was inaugurated by watering the plant by the Chief Guest Dr. Sachin, Cardiologist, Dr. Ganesh, Executive, Sri Pranesh, Deputy Manager for marketing, Prof. Dr. M. S. Sudhadevi, Principal, Saraswathi Law College, Chitradurga, and other dignitaries on the dais.

Dr. Sachin, Cardiologist, Sahyadri Narayana Multi Specialty Hospital, Shivamogga, as the Resource Person addressed the gathering and said Your heart health is central to overall good health. It's responsible for pumping nutrient-rich blood throughout your body, it supplies oxygen while removing toxins and waste. He also said CPR is the most effective method to help someone having a heart attack and losing consciousness! He taught the steps for CPR i.e.

- With your knees bent beside the victim, place the heel of your hand in the center of their chest.
- Place the other hand over the first, and make sure your fingers are interlocked.
- Lean over the victim while maintaining a straight arm position, and firmly operate chest compressions for four to six centimeters, then release it.

Steps for CPR also include providing rescue breaths! Ideally, you want to administer two rescue breaths following thirty chest compressions.

- To achieve this, place one hand on the forehead and the other hand's two fingers just below the patient's chin.
- Pinch the patient's nose with your finger and thumb while keeping the hand on their forehead to let their lips fall open.

- Inhale and close your lips to create a seal around the victim's mouth, and blow till the victim's chest lifts.

If you are unable to do two rescue breaths, perform continuous chest compressions instead! Continue CPR until the individual begins breathing regularly and exhibiting signs of life; or until emergency assistance becomes available.

He also gave demonstration of the CPR, then, he gave the chance to the students to take part in the demonstration and have self experience. The time was also provided for the students for their queries, which was answered in a most satisfactory way.

Prof. Dr. M. S. Sudhadevi, Principal, Saraswathi Law College, Chitradurga was presiding the programme and addressed the gathering that Heart attacks are life-threatening conditions that are sadly becoming very common not only in our nation, but all over the world. However, with basic first aid in heart attack, it is possible to save someone's life! Determining which first aid measures will be most successful can change the outcome of the situation. She concluded by saying that Hope the students will experiment this process which have been taught today for the heart patient in emergency.

The programme was concluded by vote of thanks. Around 250 students were benefited by this Demonstration for first aid to the victims of heart attack.

Report on Students Educational visit of Lok Adalat

Date: 08/03/2025

On 8th March 2025 a group of students from 4th sem., 3 years LL.B. students of Saraswathi Law college, Chitradurga, had the opportunity to visit the Lok Adalat organized at Chitradurga District Court. The visit was aimed at providing the students with practical exposure to the alternative dispute resolution mechanism and enhancing their understanding of real-time legal proceedings. The visit was coordinated by Dr. L. Srishyla, Assistant Professor and Dr. Ramesha .K., Assistant Professor.

The primary objective of the visit was to familiarize students with the functioning of Lok Adalats, their role in the judicial system, and their effectiveness in resolving disputes amicably. The students were expected to observe the proceedings, interact with legal professionals, and understand the significance of this legal institution in providing accessible and speedy justice.

An Overview of Lok Adalat was already given to the students in the college campus as Lok Adalat, meaning "People's Court," is an alternative dispute resolution (ADR) forum in India that facilitates the settlement of cases through conciliation and compromise. It operates under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987, and provides an inexpensive, swift, and amicable resolution to pending cases.

During the visit, the students observed various cases related to civil disputes, matrimonial issues, motor accident claims, and petty criminal matters being settled through mutual agreement. The key takeaways from the visit included:

1. **Speedy Justice:** The cases were resolved within a short span of time, highlighting the efficiency of Lok Adalats in reducing case backlogs in the judiciary.
2. **Informal and Friendly Environment:** Unlike regular court proceedings, the Lok Adalat functioned in a less formal manner, ensuring that both parties felt comfortable presenting their concerns.
3. **No Court Fees:** The students learned that the proceedings were cost-effective as there were no court fees involved, making justice accessible to all.

4. **Binding Decisions:** The settlements reached in the Lok Adalat hold the same legal status as a court decree, and no further appeal is allowed, ensuring finality in resolution.
5. **Role of Mediators and Legal Experts:** The students had the chance to interact with legal professionals, including judges, lawyers, and mediators, gaining insight into their roles in facilitating dispute resolution.

The students engaged in discussions with judges, legal aid officials, and disputing parties to understand the challenges and benefits of this system. Many students expressed their appreciation for the practical exposure and emphasized the importance of ADR mechanisms in reducing judicial burdens.

The visit served as a valuable learning opportunity, equipping students with a deeper understanding of the Indian legal system and the significance of Lok Adalats in achieving accessible justice for all.

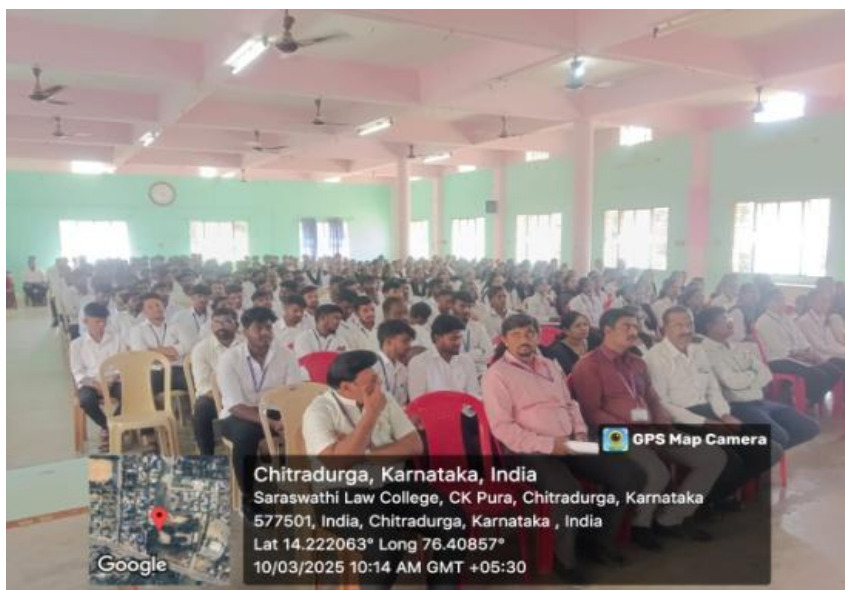

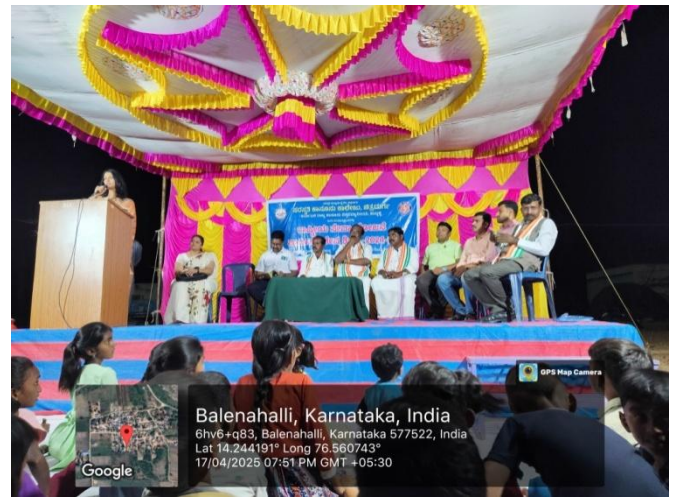

As is the custom every year, for the academic year 2024-25, the village of Jodichikkenahalli Gollarahatti was identified for a one-week NSS (National Service Scheme) camp. Under the leadership of the college's Physical Education Director, T.C. Murugeshappa, students studying in various courses and classes at the college voluntarily participated in the camp. Starting from 17.04.2025, intended programs such as various cleaning activities, a free medical checkup camp, informing villagers about government facilities, and various awareness programs were conducted for a week, concluding on 23.04.2025.

Every year, the camp undertakes the task of ensuring that the villages where the camp is held are provided with basic amenities and other government facilities of which they have been deprived. Accordingly, for the valedictory ceremony of the program on the final day, dated 23.04.2025, Judge M. Vijay, Member Secretary of the District Legal Services Authority, Chitradurga District Court, was invited. He was informed about the current shortcomings in the village, specifically that there has been no government transportation system for the village for about 75 years. Responding to the appeal, Judge M. Vijay, Member Secretary of the District Legal Services Authority, instructed the concerned authorities to verify this matter and take necessary action. As a result, the concerned officials took appropriate measures and arranged a government bus for the transportation of the people of Jodichikkenahalli village.

Due to this effort, the transportation system, which had been a primary demand of the villagers of Jodichikkenahalli for about 75 years, was established through the NSS camp organized by Saraswati Law College. This effort received widespread appreciation, and the public representatives, leaders, and villagers of Jodichikkenahalli village expressed their gratitude to the camp participants with great enthusiasm.

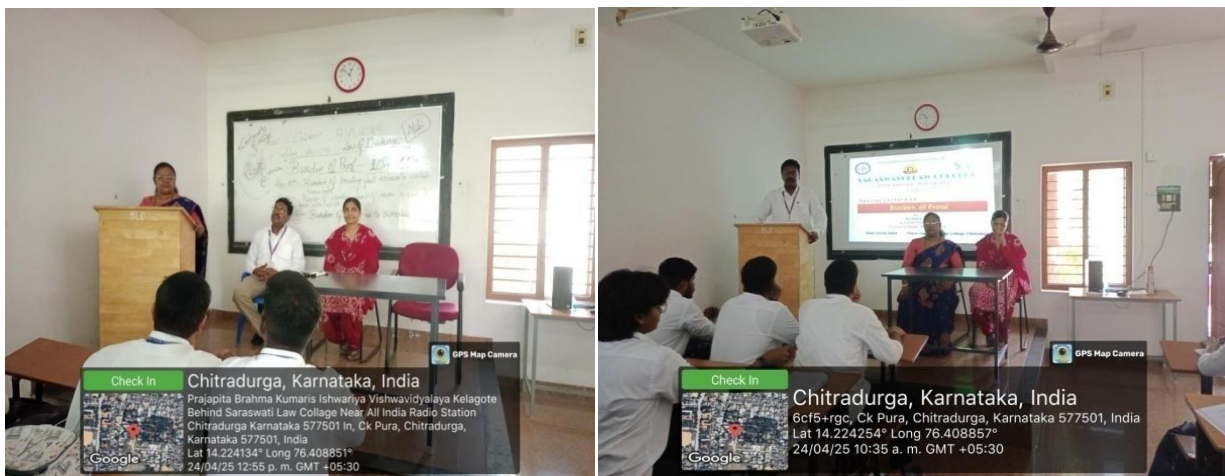

Report on Educational Visit to the Mediation Centre of Saddharma Nyaya Peetha (Seat of Justice) at Taralabalu Jagadguru Brihanmatha at Sirigere Village, Chitradurga

Date: 28/04/2025

A delegation of students from Saraswathi Law College, Chitradurga, embarked on an educational visit to the Saddharma Nyaya Peetha (Seat of Justice) at Taralabalu Jagadguru Brihan Matha in Sirigere. This initiative aimed to provide students with practical insights into alternative dispute resolution mechanisms and the role of traditional institutions in delivering justice.

The Saddharma Nyaya Peetha, under the leadership of Jagadguru Shivamurthy Shivacharya Swamiji, serves as a traditional court addressing various disputes, including caste-related issues, property conflicts, and family matters. Since the 1940s, this institution has played a pivotal role in community-based adjudication, emphasizing conciliation and moral guidance over punitive measures.

The primary objectives of the visit were:

- **Understanding ADR:** To comprehend the practical applications of Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) methods in community settings.
- **Cultural Integration:** To appreciate the integration of cultural and religious practices in conflict resolution.

Activities Undertaken During the visit:

- **Observed Proceedings:** Witnessed live mediation sessions, gaining insights into traditional dispute resolution techniques.
- **Interacted with Authorities:** Engaged in discussions with Swamiji and other officials about the center's history, procedures, and impact.
- **Participated in Workshops:** Attended sessions on the principles of mediation and the importance of cultural sensitivity in legal practices.

Date: 28.04.2025

In line with its vision to enhance experiential learning, **Saraswathi Law College, Chitradurga**, organized a series of **batch-wise educational visits** to the **Saddharma Nyaya Peetha** located at Taralabalu Jagadguru Brihan Matha, **Sirigere**. This traditional mediation centre plays a significant role in resolving disputes through moral and cultural dialogue, offering law students practical exposure to **Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR)** practices.

The purpose of the visits was to:

- Provide hands-on exposure to traditional mediation systems.
- Bridge academic knowledge with community-level justice practices.
- Encourage reflection on the integration of culture, ethics, and justice.
- Understand the scope of ADR outside the formal judicial framework.

□ Batch 1 –

- **Date:** 28th April 2025
- **Participants:** 3 Years LL.B. 4th Sem.
- **Activities:**
 - Orientation about the history and procedures of the Peetha.
 - Observation of introductory-level mediation cases.
 - Brief session with the administrative team on the ethical framework used.

□ **Batch 2**

- **Date:** 4th May 2025
- **Participants:** 3 Years LL.B. 4th Sem. and 5 Years B.A.LL.B., 8th Sem.
- **Activities:**
 - Live observation of civil and domestic dispute mediations.
 - Interactive discussion with officials and learned monks on procedural justice.
 - Group reflections on comparative advantages of traditional ADR systems.

□ **Batch 3**

- **Date:** 19th May 2025
- **Participants:** 3 Years LL.B. 4th Sem.
- **Activities:**
 - Deep-dive analysis of landmark cases resolved at the centre.
 - One-on-one Q&A session with Swamiji on jurisprudence and social reform.
 - Workshop on drafting mediation reports and proposing legal solutions.

All batches reported valuable insights, including:

- **Cultural Sensitivity in Law:** Understanding how local values influence dispute resolution.
- **Efficiency of Mediation:** Learning about timely resolutions without legal delays.
- **Trust-Based Justice:** Seeing how community trust sustains informal legal mechanisms.
- **Human-Centric Law Practice:** Observing empathy and reconciliation in action.

Students shared positive feedback regarding:

- The real-life applicability of classroom ADR concepts.
- Exposure to non-litigious and ethical conflict resolution.
- The inspirational leadership of Jagadguru Shivacharya Swamiji in ensuring social harmony.

The batch-wise educational visits to **Saddharma Nyaya Peetha** enriched the legal acumen of Saraswathi Law College students by exposing them to grassroots justice rooted in cultural wisdom. Date: 21/07/2025

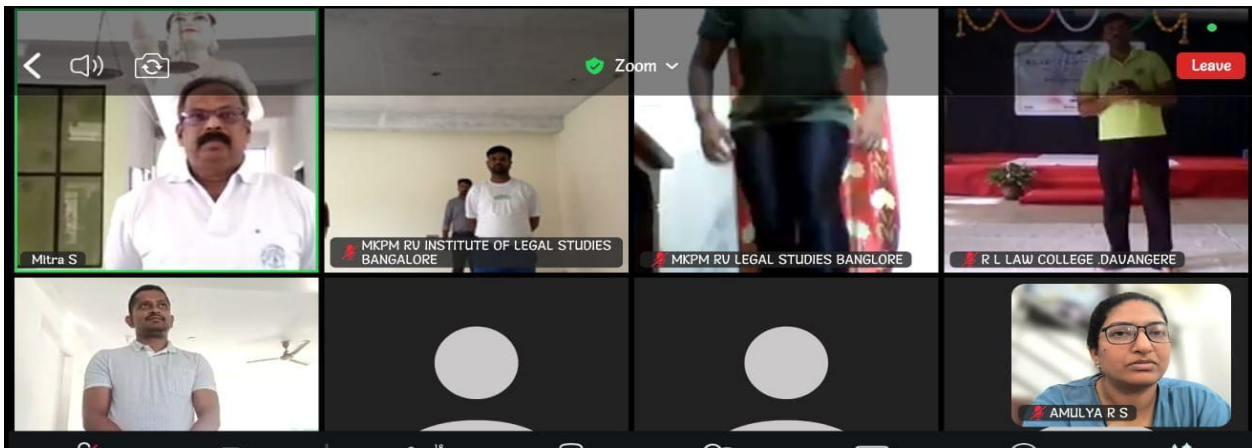

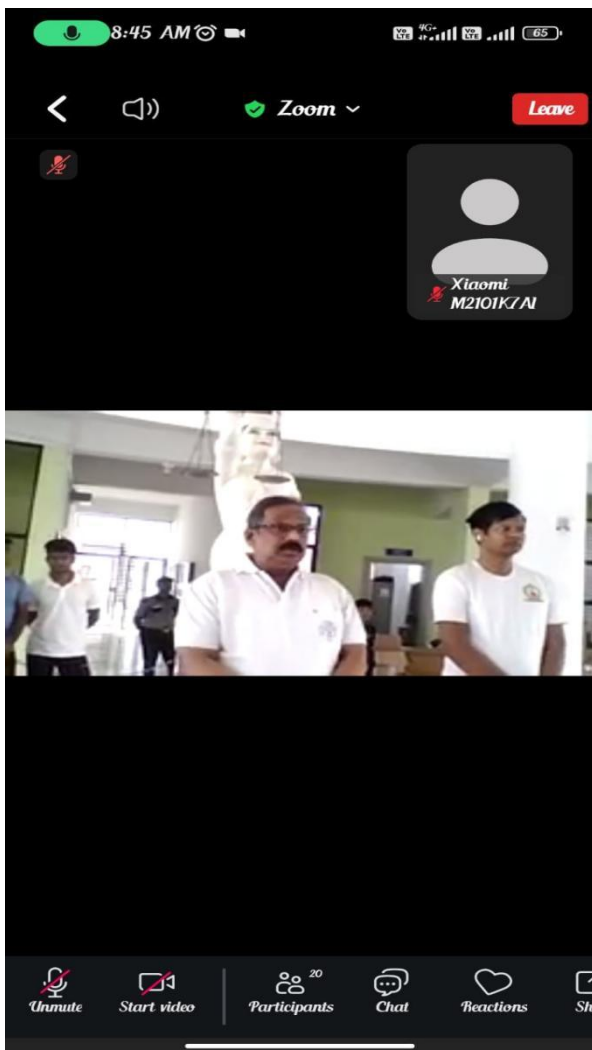
